Materials

1 panel	24 Inch Panel - Red (A)	771P-88
1 3/8 yards	Folio Basics - Black (B)	7755-99
1 1/3 yards	Plaid - Red (C)	763-88*
1 yard	Folio Basics - Christmas Green (D)	7755-66
1/2 yard	Tossed Allover Bell - Cream (E)	764-44
3/4 yard	Saint Nick - Cream (F)	768-44
1/2 yard	Twinkle - Cream (G)	135-40
1 7/8 yards	Ornament - Black (H)	767-99
4 1/2 yards	Scenic - White (Backing)	762-01

*Includes binding

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the 24 Inch Panel - Red (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 21 1/2" x 31 1/2" rectangle, centered on Saint Nick panel.
- (10) 3 1/2" squares, centered on the small blocks.

From the Folio Basics - Black (B), cut:

- (2) 3 1/2" x 25 1/2" WOF strips.
- (2) 2 1/2" x 31 1/2" WOF strips.
- (6) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (96) 2 1/2" squares.
- (5) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.
- (3) 1" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1" x 11 1/2" strips.
- (3) 1" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1" x 12 1/2" strips.

From the Plaid - Red (C), cut:

- (8) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (120) 2 1/2" squares.
- (2) 1" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 1" x 3 1/2" strips.
- (3) 1" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 1" x 4 1/2" strips.
- (7) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Folio Basics - Christmas Green (D), cut:

- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 2 1/2" squares.
- (9) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

From the Tossed Allover Bell - Cream (E), cut:

- (5) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) 2 1/2" squares.

From the Saint Nick - Cream (F), cut:

- (2) 11 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 11 1/2" squares.

From the Twinkle - Cream (G), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 60 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 51 1/2" strips.

From the Ornament - Black (H), cut:

- (2) 5 1/2" x 63 1/2" (length of fabric) LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 5 1/2" x 61 1/2" WOF strips, piece as needed.

From the Scenic - White (Backing), cut:

- (2) 81" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 69" x 81" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 31 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of the 21 1/2" x 31 1/2" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 3 1/2" x 25 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). Trim the block to measure 24 1/2" x 36 1/2".

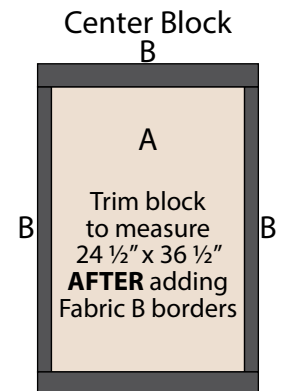

2. Sew (1) 1" x 11 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 11 1/2" Fabric F square. Sew (1) 1" x 12 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric F square to make (1) 12 1/2" Unit 1 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (4) Unit 1 squares total.

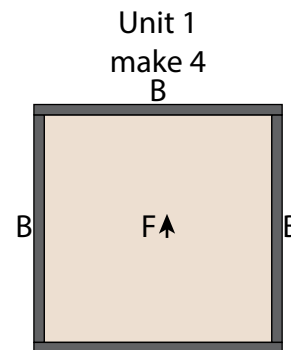

3. Place (1) 2 1/2" Fabric B square on the top left corner of (1) Unit 1 square, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 4).

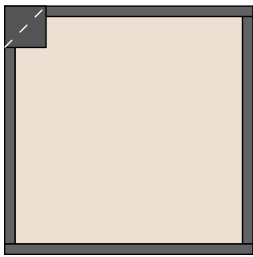

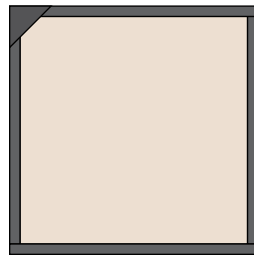

4. Follow Figure 5 for the seam direction to add a 2 1/2" Fabric B square to each of the remaining corners of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 6).

5. Repeat Steps 3-4 to make (4) Block One squares total.

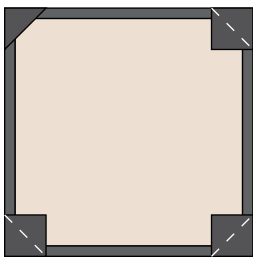

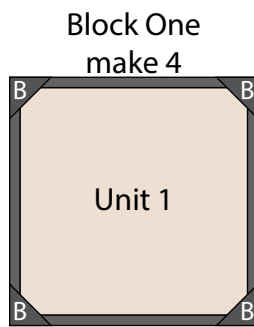

6. Sew (1) 1" x 3 1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) 3 1/2" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 1" x 4 1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (10) Unit 2 squares total.

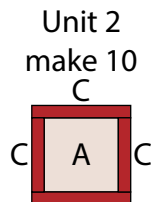

7. Place (1) 2 1/2" Fabric C square on the left side of (1) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" Fabric B strip, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance (Fig. 9).

8. Place another 2 1/2" Fabric C square on the right side of the 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" Fabric B strip, right sides together (Fig. 10). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 10). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 11).

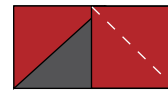

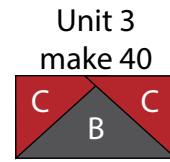

9. Repeat Steps 7-8 to make (40) Unit 3 strips total.

10. Repeat Steps 7-8 and refer to Figures 12-13 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (40) Unit 4 strips and (40) Unit 5 strips.

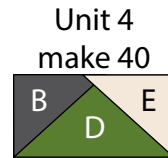

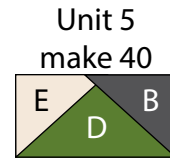

11. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to the left end of (1) Unit 5 strip, along the Fabric E sides, to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 14). Repeat to make (40) Unit 4 strips total.

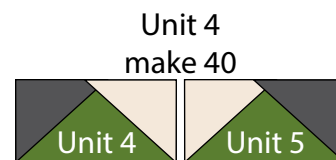

12. Sew (1) 2 1/2" Fabric D square to each end of (1) Unit 3 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 8 1/2" Unit 5 square (Fig. 15). Repeat to make (10) Unit 5 squares total.

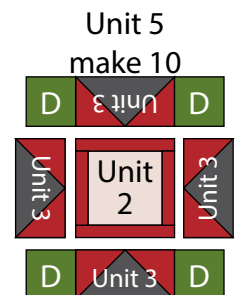
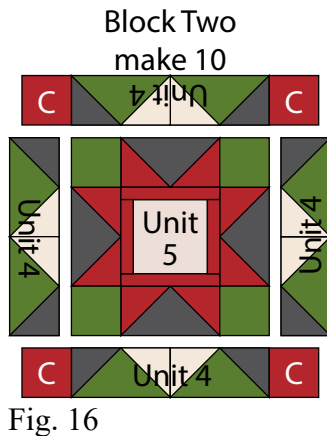
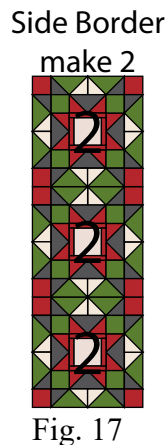

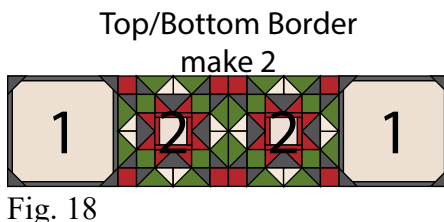
13. Sew (1) 2 ½” Fabric C square to each end of (1) Unit 4 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to each side of (1) Unit 5 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 12 ½” Block Two square (Fig. 16). Repeat to make (10) Block Two squares total.



14. Sew together (3) Block Two squares to make (1) Side Border (Fig. 17). Repeat to make a second Side Border.



15. Sew together (2) Block Two squares. Sew (1) Block One square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border (Fig. 18). Repeat to make the Bottom Border.



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

16. Sew (1) Side Border to each side of the Center Block.

17. Sew the Top Border and the Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

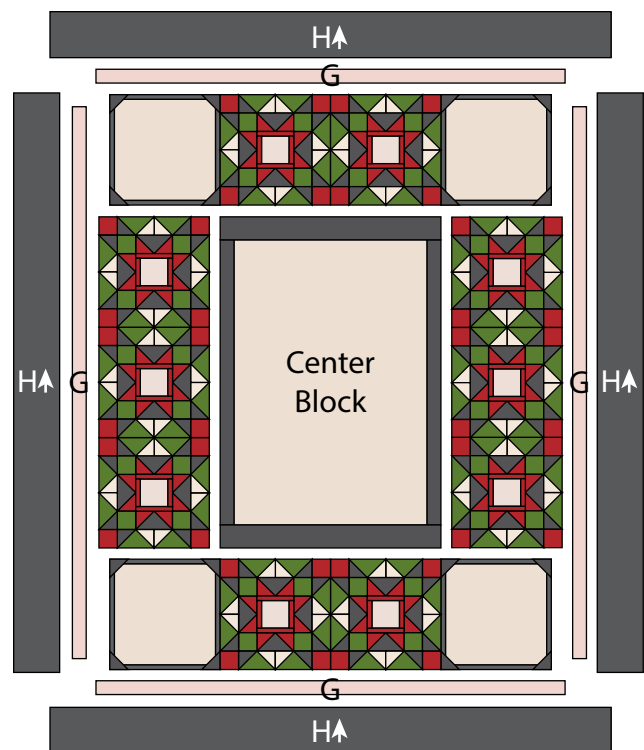
18. Sew (1) 2” x 60 ½” Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2” x 51 ½” Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

19. Sew (1) 5 ½” x 63 ½” Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 ½” x 61 ½” Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

20. Layer and quilt as desired.

21. Sew the (7) 2 ½” x WOF Fabric C strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

22. Bind as desired.
