## Fabrics in the Collection



Materials
$1 / 4$ yard Houses - Gray (A)
6761-89
$1 / 4$ yard Stockings Allover - White/Multi (B) 6759-89
2/3 yard Snowflake - Red (C) 6763-88
$3 / 4$ yard $\quad$ Swirl - White/Gray (D) 6766-9
$2 / 3$ yard Novelty Stripe - Multi (E) 6765-89
$13 / 4$ yards Reindeer - White/Multi (F) 6764-89
$2 / 3$ yard Buffalo Check - Blk/Red (G) 6760-88
$5 / 8$ yard Swirl - Black (H) 6766-99
$31 / 4$ yards Doves - Black (Backing) 6762-99
*Includes binding

## Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Houses - Gray (A), cut:
-(1) $61 / 2 " x$ WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (6) $61 / 2 "$ squares.
From the Stockings Allover - White/Multi (B), cut:
-(1) $6 \frac{112 "}{2 \prime} \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut strip into (6) $61 / 2 "$ squares.
From the Snowflake - Red (C), cut:
-(10) $2 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (192) 2" squares.

## From the Swirl - White/Gray (D), cut:

-(8) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (96) 2" x 3 ½" strips.

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut strips into (48) 2" squares.


## From the Novelty Stripe - Multi (E), fussy cut:

- (12) $91 / 2 " \times 5 "$ strips, each from a row of houses.


## From the Reindeer - White/Multi (F), fussy cut:

- (4) $4 " \times 541 / 2 "$ Length of Fabric (LOF) strips, each centered on a row of reindeer.


## From the Buffalo Check - Blk/Red (G), cut:

-(11) $11 / 2 " x$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (8) $11 / 2 " \times 541 / 2 "$ strips.

From the Swirl - Black (H), cut:

- (6) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips for the binding.

From the Doves - Black (Backing), cut:

- (2) 57 " x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 57 " x 62 " back.


## Sewing Instructions

1. Place (1) 2 " Fabric C square on the left side of (1) $2 " \times 31 / 2 "$ Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 2). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance.

2. Place another 2" Fabric C square on the right side of the $2 " \times 31 / 2 "$ Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance to make (1) CDC unit (Fig. 4).
3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (96) CDC units total.

4. Sew (2) CDC units together end to end to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (48) Unit 1 strips total.

Block One
5. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1) $61 / 2 "$
Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" Fabric D square to each end of (1) Unit 1 strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Block One (Fig. 6). Repeat to make (6) Block Ones total.

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8. Sew (1) Block One, (1) $91 / 2 " \times 5 "$ Fabric E strip,
(1) Block Two, (1) $9 \frac{1 / 2 "}{} \times 5$ " Fabric E strip, (1) Block One,
(1) $91 / 2 " \times 5 "$ Fabric E strip, (1) Block Two and
(1) $91 / 2 " \times 5 "$ Fabric E strip together, in that order, to make
(1) Column One. Repeat to make a second Column One.
9. Sew (1) $91 / 2 " \times 5 "$ Fabric E strip, (1) Block Two, (1) $91 / 2 " \times 5 "$ Fabric E strip, (1) Block One, (1) $91 / 2 " \times 5 "$ Fabric E strip, (1) Block Two, (1) $91 / 2 " \times 5 "$ Fabric E strip and (1) Block One together, in that order, to make (1) Column Two.
10. Sew (1) F Column, (1) Column One, (1) F Column, (1) Column Two, (1) F Column, (1) Column One and (1) F Column together lengthwise and in that order to make the quilt top.
11. Layer and quilt as desired.
12. Sew the (6) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF Fabric $H$ strips together, end to end with 45 -degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
13. Bind as desired.

## Quilt Top Assembly

## (Refer to the Quilt Layout while assembling.)

7. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 541 / 2$ " Fabric G strip to each side of (1) 4 " x $541 / 2$ " Fabric F strip lengthwise to make (1) F Column. Repeat to make (4) F Columns total.

6. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1) $61 / 2$ " Fabric B square. Sew (1) 2" Fabric D square to each end of (1) Unit 1 strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric B square to make (1) Block Two (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (6) Block Twos total.
